Profits of Prejudice

May 1988	Chuck Cushman, professional "property rights" agitator, is the featured speaker at PARR's national convention to oppose honoring Indian treaties.
Dec. 1991	Ron Arnold, architect of the anti-environmentalist "Wise Use" movement, meets with Building Industry Association officials Art Castle, Jim Klauser and other industry lobbyists to discuss the formation of the Washington Property Rights Network.
May 1992	CLUE (incorporated by Art Castle, Bill Geyer and Skip Richards) hires Chuck Cushman to organize a "property rights" movement in Whatcom County.
July 1992	Steve Brisbane and Bruce Ayers join CLUE's board of directors.
June 1993	Bruce Ayers, Lesa Starkenburg, Anna Williams, Cleo Callen, Jean Gorton, Bob Weisen and others join Art Castle and Bill Geyer in forming the Keystone Forum PAC.
Sept. 1993	Keystone PAC backs Marlene Dawson, fee land owner and member of UPOW – Washington's foremost anti-Indian group, for Whatcom County Council.
Oct. 1994	CLUE officers Skip Richards and Kathy Sutter host militia and anti-Indian speakers at Laurel Grange.
Jan. 1995	Whatcom County Council member Marlene Dawson urges U.S. Senator Slade Gorto to "drastically cut Lummi funding" on behalf of fee land owners on the reservation.
May 1995	Citizens for Liberty holds a public meeting with Sheriff Dale Brandland about militias. Fee land owners are warned by Sheriff Brandland that they should not "take the law into their own hands."
Sept. 1995	KGMI talk show host Jeff Kent leads Fee Land Owners Association (FLOA) representatives Jeff McKay and Linnea Smith in an hour-long diatribe against the Lummis.
Nov. 1995	Citizens for Liberty, a militia recruiting group, sponsors a talk by Ron Arnold. The Whatcom Human Rights Task Force organizes a community education meeting to expose Arnold's violent rhetoric and Citizen's for Liberty's racist agenda.
Sept. 1996	Whatcom County Council members Alvin Starkenburg, Kathy Sutter, Tom Brown, Ward Nelson and Bob Imhof (all of whom received electoral support from Keystone PAC) retroactively approve travel funds for County Council member Marlene Dawson's attack on the Lummis before Sen. Gorton's Committee on Indian Affairs.
Dec. 1996	Keystone PAC appoints FLOA member Jeff McKay as their new director and hosts former talk-show pundit Jeff Kent as the keynote speaker at Keystone PAC's annual Christmas Party.
